# Kane Street Food Rescue (KSFR)

The KSFR helps our congregation fulfill the commandment of me'achal re'evim, feeding the hungry, and the commandment of ba'al tash'chit, not wasting food, by "rescuing" leftover food from kiddush and other Kane Street events and delivering it to a local homeless shelter.

Members of the congregation have been doubly generous: once by sharing their simcha in sponsoring a kiddush; and again in allowing us to gather up what is left from the kiddush to be donated to the shelter residents. This openhandedness is greatly appreciated by the Food Rescue team and by the shelter recipients.

We have a roster of participants who are schleppers and drivers but more are always welcome so the work is shared. The pickups are made at the shul around 9am on Sunday mornings and take about an hour from start to finish – a great way to start a day. ## Homeless Shelter

Kane Street staffs the BHS Shelter on Remsen Street for homeless women during three weeks each December. We are proud of the great number of Kane Street members who have volunteered with us at the Shelter over the years. In 2008, Kane Street received a Jewish Social Action Month grant from UJA-Federation of New York, challenging the community to expand its participation in and commitment to the Shelter. With the support of the grant, 175 Kane Street members of all ages, participated by cooking and serving meals, spending the night, and creating take-away packages for the guests of the Shelter. The grant also helped defray the custodial expenses of the Shelter. Volunteer this year to spend the night with a friend or cook and serve dinner.
